While donning a pair of rubber gloves, slightly dampen the gloves and glide your hands over your couch, car seats, or curtains. The static electricity caused by rubbing the gloves over the surface attracts fur, lifting it easily and quickly. For carpets, try using a window squeegee. Dragging it across your carpet helps to pull embedded fur to the surface, simplifying your vacuuming efforts.

4. Arm Yourself with Baking Soda

Baking soda is an affordable weapon in your fight against pet odors. Sprinkle it liberally over carpets, pet beds, or even stuffed toys and let it sit overnight. The baking soda absorbs and neutralizes bad smells, leaving your home refreshed after you vacuum it up the next day. For stubborn smells on clothes, add baking soda directly to your laundry cycle because it boosts cleanliness and tackles tough odors effortlessly.

5. Keep Odors at Bay with Pet-Friendly Scents

Investing in scent diffusers can help maintain a fresh-smelling home effortlessly. However, no ordinary scents will do, as these chemicals will harm your pet. To stay on the safe side, choose diffusers labeled "safe for pets." Read the label to ensure that the scents are made from natural essential oils and not chemicals. If there's one appliance that must always be in your home, it's a high-quality vacuum cleaner equipped with a HEPA (high-efficiency particulate air) filter. These products are specially designed to trap pet hair, dander, and tiny allergens, significantly improving your home's cleanliness and air quality. Make it a habit to vacuum frequently, paying close attention to your pet's favorite spots and places where pet hair usually gathers, such as under a table.

11. Air Purifiers Mean Fresh Air Indoors

An air purifier significantly improves indoor air quality by picking up pet hair, dander, dust, and odors from the air. For maximum effectiveness, place one in the room where your pets spend most of their time. Not only does this make your home feel cleaner, but it also reduces potential allergens, creating a healthier environment for everyone.
